



COUNSELING REFERRAL CENTER

MENTAL HEALTH ACCESS FOR ALL

YWCA Greater Austin Counseling and Referral Center (YWCRC) serves the community by offering trauma-informed, multi-lingual, multicultural services for individuals, couples, families, youth and groups. Services provided include mental health therapy and support, consultation referrals to Care Coordination, life skills and personal empowerment programs, and professional development training.



COUNSELING REFERRAL CENTER MENTAL HEALTH ACCESS FOR ALL

Texas is home to more than 175,000 female veterans, with more than 6,000 of those in the greater Austin area alone. The YWCA Greater Austin mission offers comprehensive support to female veterans and their families through our individual, couples, and family counseling services that are focused on building connections, coping with trauma, and improving relationships.

Our clients often reach out to us at the worst moments, in crisis, when they are without hope and direction. Through the work we do, we can transform individuals and families to help female veterans recognize they have a life worth living.

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION

Successfully serving youth since 1996 with TCADA, and later DSHS funding, GenYW has worked to serve youth in Central Texas through strong community ties, collaborations and partnerships.

Programming consists of weekly curriculum-based educational groups during school hours that work toward increasing youth resiliency, expanding knowledge about the personal and cultural consequences, and increasing feelings of empowerment and community connectedness. Currently, in collaboration with Communities In Schools, weekly groups are targeted to Austin Independent School District campuses and work toward improving the youth's relationships to their school and community, as well as building their resiliency skills.



GENYW

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION

GenYW provides STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) groups through AISD. STEM groups are a 6-week program for girls in grades 3rd - 8th to explore STEM learning, participate in socio-emotional growth activities, build confidence and connection, and innovate. We utilize science and technology tasks while building social-emotional skills and making fun memories and connections. Through this program, we foster a love for science in young women in Texas and share this opportunity with families who are open to enriching their lives and broadening their interest and understanding of STEM within their home.

STEM teaches critical thinking and innovation. The focus on logical thought processes and problem-solving allows students to develop mental habits that will help them succeed in any field. STEM coursework challenges students to think critically and come up with their own solutions.



145 students had no previous computer science experience.

160 students expressed interest in pursuing computer science further.

CARE COORDINATION

ADVOCACY, CONNECTION & COLLABORATION

Care Coordination at YWCA Greater Austin is a trauma-informed holistic program dedicated to assisting clients in eliminating barriers to accessing the services they need. Care Coordinators recognize and acknowledge systemic and institutional challenges in order to restore a client's sense of dignity. Through Care Coordination, we assess needs and goals and work collaboratively with the on-site therapist, external resources, support systems, and community organizations to provide effective comprehensive care.




CARE COORDINATION

ADVOCACY, CONNECTION & COLLABORATION

Includes short-term/limited case management and the provision of short-term, emergency financial assistance to help families in crisis access childcare, along with life skills classes.

- 36 children were afforded an estimated 30, 461 hours of childcare, allowing 22 families to work towards building a secure financial future for themselves (this decrease is a result of inflation due to Covid-19)
- 279 case management clients almost 18% increase from 2021
- **61%** of children served reported homeless / near-homeless / homeless due to fleeing Domestic Violence
- 100% of clients were below 30% of the median household income



VOLUNTEER & TRAINING INSTITUTEBUILDING CAPACITY FOR SOCIAL CHANGE

YWCA Greater Austin is committed to implementing racial and social justice programming in our daily work. The Training Institute provides a space for education, personal growth, and professional development that builds capacity for social change. Offering educational and informative presentations by mental health professionals, social workers, educators, school counselors, youth workers, nationally-known speakers, and others working in social service organizations, provides the opportunity to disseminate new ideas on racial justice and equity in our communities.

The Training Institute includes the provision of continuing education units for licensed professionals, as well as personalized organizational training for community entities seeking to address equity issues in their work.

YWCA Greater Austin's Training Institute is a regionally recognized training site for students completing their licensure requirements in social work and counseling.



WARMLINE

AUSTIN TALKS, WE LISTEN

In an effort to alleviate the stressors and isolation created by Covid-19, YWCA Greater Austin provides a Warmline to assist people who may want to speak with someone to feel connected. The Warmline is staffed by volunteer mental health professionals and peers with shared experiences that have been trained in providing emotional support and assistance.

The Warmline is for people with emerging non-emergency thoughts and feelings that have arisen or have been exacerbated by the current health crisis and who may benefit from receiving emotional support and a space for connection. YWCA understands that connection to others and emotional support are basic human needs and help to cope in difficult situations. The Warmline is designed to prevent a mental health crisis.



WARMLINE

AUSTIN TALKS, WE LISTEN

In 2022, YWCA Greater Austin Warmline callers reported feelings of loneliness, anxiety, and worries about relationship conflicts. Callers shared life stressors and concerns about money and housing. Agency staff, interns, and volunteers responded to each of these calls with compassion and understanding. Many callers ended the phone call reporting improvement in mood with feelings of hope, safety, validation, and gratitude.


